Angela (Angi) Southworth, the Executive Director at Child Connect for Family Success, works with the early childhood community to ensure parents, caregivers, educators, and those interacting with children have access to quality resources and opportunities for personal and professional training. As a mother of four and an early childhood educator, Angela knows the importance of secure attachment and exploration in the development of a young child. She believes the more one knows

Additionally, she holds an A.A. in Business Administration from Wayne County Community College and a Master of Arts in Early Childhood Education from Madonna University. Angela is currently exploring professional development paths related to educational technology.

Angela called Redford home until three years ago when she moved to Howell with her husband and children. Their home came with the typical appliances...and chickens.
